## Growing in Grace & Gratitude

I'll never forget the evening that I met with the Session of my home church, after one year in seminary. An elder said, "Tell us how Presbyterian theology differs from other denominations." I said something about how we understand sin and forgiveness, even though I hadn't studied theology yet.

Having been raised in a denomination that nurtured a sense of fear and guilt, however, I had hungered for my pastor's message of God's grace when I joined the Presbyterian church. And that *is* what distinguishes Presbyterians from many other denominations: a life of faith that is rooted in grace and gratitude.

Starting on Sunday, Sept. 6, we will follow the new Presbyterian curriculum, *Growing in Grace & Gratitude*. Our children will gather in God's grace, celebrate the meaning of this grace in their lives as they encounter a living God, and learn to respond joyfully in gratitude. With fun activities, prayer and singing, the children will learn to live their lives as an expression of God's grace.

And so will we adults, as we explore the same scripture lessons in worship, experience God's grace in our lives, and respond with gratitude. As a faith community, we will grow in wonder and gratitude for God's grace, and find new ways to pay it forward.

In his July 28 essay, "The Structure of Gratitude," David Brooks wrote: "We live in a capitalist meritocracy that encourages individualism and utilitarianism, ambition and pride. But this society would fall apart if not for another economy, one in which gifts surpass expectations, in which insufficiency is acknowledged, and dependence celebrated. Gratitude is the ability to see and appreciate this other almost magical economy."

As Presbyterians, we find freedom and joy in knowing that God's grace exceeds our every expectation; that our efforts are insufficient to earn God's love, and we are dependent upon God and one another. May we, God's children of all ages, grow in gratitude of God's grace in our life and in the world!

In the daily devotional *Jesus Calling* by Sarah Young, Jesus speaks to us. On July 24, Jesus said: THANKFULNESS OPENS THE DOOR to My Presence. Though I am always with you, I have gone to great measures to preserve your freedom of choice. I have placed a door between you and Me, and I have empowered you to open or close that door. There are many ways to open it, but a grateful attitude is one of the most effective.

Thankfulness is built on a substructure of trust. When thankful words stick in your throat, you need to check up on your foundation of trust. When thankfulness flows freely from your heart and lips, let your gratitude draw you closer to Me. I want you to learn the art of *giving thanks in all circumstances*. See how many times you can thank Me daily; this will awaken your awareness to a multitude of blessings. It will also cushion the impact of trials when they come against you. Practice My Presence by practicing the discipline of thankfulness.

How grateful are you for our church property? Grateful enough


- to join the Property Team that meets 10 am on the 2nd Tuesday (or we'll reschedule the day/time to fit your schedule)?



They learn that they are not alone, and that they have choices that lead to healthy, life-giving decisions. The group meets here on **Fridays at 1 pm**. Anyone who wants to learn more is encouraged to come.

**Narcotics Anonymous** offers recovery from the effects of addiction to alcohol or any mind-altering substance through working a twelve-step program, including regular attendance at group meetings. The group atmosphere provides help from peers and offers ongoing support network for addicts who wish to pursue and maintain a drug-free lifestyle.
