Stewardship Update

Thank you to everyone who pledged their time and talent and financial resources for the church's ministry in 2016. To the Session, your action is worth much more than dollars and cents – it inspires and energizes us to continue to give of ourselves as your leaders and servants of Jesus Christ. Thank you.



As of Nov. 29, we received 38 pledges totaling \$59,814. Of the 38 received to date, 16 were able to continue giving at the 2015 level. 5 were new pledges and 6 increased their pledge from last year. 5 decreased from last year, and 6 apparently intended to continue the amount you gave in 2015, but because we asked for a 'monthly' amount instead of a 'weekly' amount, the total for the year decreased. If you intend to give at 2015 level, please let Laure Childers, the treasurer, know by calling the church office. Thank you—everyone!

We recognize that many people have fixed incomes, or young children, or children in college, and a multitude of expenses. We trust that everyone considered what they could pledge in prayer with God. And we are grateful. We must, however, let you know that the estimated income falls far short of our estimated expenses. And Session will need to continue to discern what Christ is calling us to do with what we have.

Part of the shortfall is due to the fact that 2 members died and 4 contributors moved away. This loss totals \$8,100. But 8 members pledged a total of \$7,760 last year and they have not yet pledged for 2016. Their pledges, if they continued, would cover some of the shortfall. We are providing this information to be transparent, and to ask for your continued prayer. You could also invite a friend to worship with us!

The Presbyterian Church in Lakehurst is a "small" church and many people are surprised by the genuine care of the members for everyone who comes through the door, and by the amount of ministry that we are able to do here and abroad. We respond by saying that it is because God's Spirit guides us, equips us, and surprises <u>us</u> with all of the resources we need in order to do what God is calling us to do. We thank you for your continued prayers, presence and support.
