always listening


"IT IS NOT OVER"

Worship at Lakehurst



Advent Devotions—Here is just a sample of the inspiration that you missed if you do not "like" the church on Facebook! Might you continue this during Lent?



#Comfort by Dawn Heaney: If you really know me, you know I love a good cup of tea. It comforts me and reminds me who I am, the daughter of Irish/Scottish immigrants who always shared a cup. Kind of like going to church every week is a comfort to me and reminds me that I am also a child of God.

Spiritual Nurture

Starting this year, the **Christian Education** and **Evangelism & Fellowship** Teams will be united to focus on nurturing the life and faith of the Christian community by offering opportunities for study, fellowship, and small groups that help visitors and new members become an active part of the community. There is already an overlap of team members, and now there will be two elders leading the Spiritual Nurture Team.

Sunday School—for children ages 3 through grade 6 meets during worship after the Children's message.

Confirmation or Youth Class for older children meets monthly.

Adult Bible study—we finish the study of the Gospel of Mark this month, and will begin a new study; probably continuing to meet twice a month on Sunday mornings or Tuesday evenings.

Country Wonder—Carole Sloan sings lovely ballads at **5 pm on the 2nd Sundays.** Bring a table-ready dish to share and join us for a pot luck supper and a delightful evening of good music, good food and good fellowship.

Ladies Craft Group—Donna Lemanski leads a group that meets 1 pm on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays. Bring your craft or needlepoint project, or come to enjoy good fellowship.

Fellowship Hour—after worship, we get to know one another or catch up while we nourish our stomachs and our spirits. Please consider hosting one Sunday. The church provides coffee, tea, cups, plates, and plastic ware. The hosts bring a snack, quart of milk and juice.

Reception of New Members—the Team is always ready to welcome you into this community.

Caring for Members—along with the Deacons, we try to nurture the spirit of members who are here or in nursing centers or have moved away, but are still very much a part of this faith community. See letter from beloved long-time member Margaret Plenk on page 6. Even the Sunday School children sent cards to our 'away' members for Christmas.



Outreach in the Community—through our website, ads, and special events (like Country Wonder, VBS, Halloween treats, and Kids Fun Night at the Joint Base), we invite people to the church and to Jesus Christ.

Last month, the CE Team hosted a fun night for our Sunday School children with pizza, movies, games and ginger bread creations!

He will still be performing and travelling a bit, but having a home base has become an important part for the family.
