#### From the Pastor

I recently preached on *Matthew 10:32-39* and shared the children's story of **George the Caterpillar** who became **George the Butterfly**, but only after George was able to let go of everything he knew and squeeze himself into a dark and scary cocoon. As you can imagine, the story had a very happy ending.



With so much change already going on in our lives and in the world, the Church is the one place where we want stability, familiarity and peace. The Church is the one place where we want NO change. And yet Christ is risen and the Holy Spirit is at work *in* us and *among* us to fulfill God's plan for creation. And so, faithfully, hope-fully and lovingly-with-one-another, we move into God's amazing future.

As I learned about the decisions that came out of the PC(USA) General Assembly in June, and as I studied the lectionary passages through December for what God may be saying to us now, and as I saw that the Horizon Bible Study for Presbyterian Women in 2014-15 is Paul's letters to the Corinthians, I smiled and relaxed because the theme, I think, in all of this is "Building Community."

Our faithful, persistent and merciful God wants us to build diverse faith communities that embody God's love for all in Christ, and let the world taste the fruit of our perseverance, resilience, forgiveness and unity of spirit. And, yes, God's plan for creation has a <u>very</u> happy ending—beyond anything we can now imagine.

So, during the lazy days of summer, why don't we read *I and II Co-rinthians*, as well as the summary of the General Assembly actions (available in the Church office), and pray and play and rest so we can work with God in the fall to build community.

Thank you to all of the Men who helped us worship our Father in heaven on Father's Day, June 15. Encore! Encore!








### **Christian Education Team**



# Water, water everywhere, but do you drink enough? by BJ Nelson

We need to drink 6 to 8 glasses (8-oz.) of water every day. Are you doing that? Many people drink a lot of tea or coffee and say "I get plenty of fluids." But those beverages can be high in caffeine, which can cause dehydration and changes in your blood pressure, blood sugar level and other problems. Dehydration can affect your heart, your balance, and your digestive system. Do not get dehydrated!

Getting pure, unadulterated water isn't always easy. Much of our tap water is full of chemicals such as chlorine, sulfur, fluoride, or other minerals. So, we are more apt to filter our tap water or buy bottled water. Drink coffee, tea and soda *that are decaffeinated* or juice if you do not like plain water. With the hot weather at hand, it is essential that we stay hydrated. As ever, any questions or discussion, please track down my wheel-chair and let's chat!
