



Eye Care Can Prevent Surgery, By BJ Nelson, Parish Nurse



If you are 60 or older and do not have any sign of cataracts, you will soon. In the U.S., 75% of people over 60 have some sign of cataracts. The fact is, cataract surgery is the most common surgical procedure with over 1.6 million operations performed annually.

Currently, no effective drug therapy exists to prevent cataracts from forming. However, cigarette smoking, eye injuries, prolonged exposure to UV radiation in sunlight, diabetes and even obesity can increase the risk of cataracts. Also, long-term use of high dose corticosteroids is the most common drug-related cause of cataracts. Avoiding these risks can greatly delay cataracts.

Surgery for cataracts involves removing all or part of the lens and replacing it with an intraocular lens implant. Cataract removal is considered by many doctors to be the most effective surgical procedure in all of medicine. If the eye is normal except for the cataract, surgery will improve vision in more than 95% of cases.


