From the Pastor

As I write this, my heart is full of love and gratitude for God and for you. This month marks three years that we have witnessed together the power of God's Spirit at work here in Lakehurst.



Each year has brought challenges and blessings. Soon after I arrived, we discovered that the "reserve" account was depleted and contracts to sell some of the church's real estate were unadvisable. But a few months later, the church received several bequests which allowed me to leave my part-time work at a nursing home, and serve the church full-time in year two. And your elders and deacons served you well, prayerfully making difficult decisions and working hard.

During the second year, we worked with God to sow seeds of faith, hope and love within the community and beyond. It wasn't always fun: getting estimates for mold remediation and getting sued under one of the unadvisable contracts. But we persevered because God perseveres in sowing seeds in and with us.

And this year, the seeds began to bear fruit—lots of fruit! Just read in the Stewardship Brochure what all of the elders, deacons, Presbyterian women, and you have done with the guidance, power and grace of God. No mold. No litigation. Beautiful spaces for ministry. More music. More fellowship. More children. Larger food pantry. New people among us with hearts that love Christ.

This month, we will remember the great cloud of witnesses—our ancestors in faith, both living and dead, who brought us to this place, and we will give thanks to God for their love and their legacy. Please join us in worship as we dedicate memorial gifts and the fruit of your labors on Nov. 3, and when we join with the community to give God thanks and praise on Nov. 27.

And plan to participate in the Advent Study, beginning Wednesday, Nov. 27, as we clear our eyes to witness the birth of Christ and discern what God has in store for The Presbyterian Church in Lakehurst.

The Deacons are called to minister to those who are in need, to the sick, to the friendless, and to any who may be in distress both within and beyond the community of faith. Thanks to the grace of God and the generous sharing of personal gifts by our Deacons, members and friends, we are bearing much fruit.

Worship. Deacons are generous with their time to help us worship our Lord. Some of the Deacons serve as ushers, greeters, and worship leaders. The Deacons also work behind the scene to prepare the communion elements every month. And some serve as counters of financial offerings.

Pastoral Care. The Deacons are generous with their love and compassion. Every month we pray through the list of members and friends to identify any need or concern. We then try to reach out with a cheery card or a visit. Once a month, the Deacons host Coffee Hour to help the community stay connected. We also deliver

chancel flowers when available to homebound members—to let them know they are still a part of the church. At Christmas we gave all of the children a bag full of Christmas goodies. And on Mother's day we gave carnations to the women of our church.

Special Events. The Deacons are generous with their giving. As a way to raise funds and build community, the Deacons again hosted the **Spring Flea Market** to coincide with the Lakehurst Borough Yard Sale. This year, in addition to renting table space to outside vendors and having our own tables for baked goods and hot dogs, the Deacons compiled and sold a **Deacon's Church Cookbook**. We made over \$2,000; used \$1,000 to buy new chair cushions for the Upper Room and the balance is being used for Deacons' benevolences including transportation for homebound members.

Looking forward. We hope to build up our **Transportation Ministry** and launch a **Manna Project** of frozen soup and casseroles for members or their families in case of illness or emergency.

Thank you to everyone who supports the Board of Deacons with prayer and hands-on help with all that we do. Your generosity makes our ministry possible.

Treat Your Lungs with Tender Loving Care

Most people do not think about their lungs. We breathe automatically, without effort or thought. It is only when we become ill that we become aware of this vital human function and its frailty.

From asthma to COPD, lung cancer to influenza, and bronchitis to cystic fibrosis, there are many diseases that can cause our lungs to turn from allies to adversaries. Few of us go through life without experiencing an encounter with the respiratory tract.

The wisest course of action is to see your family doctor who can order necessary medications and preliminary tests until a specialist is deemed essential. Self-diagnosing, often with the use of the internet, is usually fool-hardy. There is no substitute for a good physician's attention, followed by self-nurturing with the goal of treating yourself to some tender loving care. Also, do not smoke, avoid second hand smoke, enjoy fresh air as often as possible, shun others who have respiratory illness, get a flu/pneumonia shot (if MD okays it) and see an MD promptly when symptoms of a respiratory illness appear. Barring acquired illnesses there are many respiratory diseases that can be either avoided or managed to keep your health at an optimum level.
