Growing in Grace & Gratitude

On Oct. 25, Rev. Wendy Bailey led about 40 members of the faith community through a process of envisioning God's greatest hopes and dreams for this church. Everyone had an opportunity to talk in their small group, and they learned a lot about people who do not sit in their pew neighborhood or fellowship table. The honest discussion strengthened the faith community and inspired everyone.

People want to keep the conversation going:

- 1. What are particular blessings of this congregation for you?
- 2. What do folks in your community know or say about this church?
- 3. What challenges is this congregation facing in the next 5 years?
- 4. And imagine that God just created the church of God's dreams in Lakehurst with the gifts that you already have. What do you see when you open the door?

We learned a lot! Some people said, "no one in my village says anything about the church, good or bad. And I don't bring it up." Others said, "We do not know each other well enough to know what they do when they're not in church. But this was a good start." And most people said they are willing to learn something new but they don't like change—an important insight as you transition with a new pastor.

But the blessings that people shared were plentiful and often repeated:

- the people are friendly, supportive and genuinely welcoming
- the church feels like home
- the people are generous in sharing their time and talent
- God is here and my relationship with God has strengthened
- I'm blessed by the music—and the children—oh, the children!
- whatever we are doing—whether worship, fellowship, mission or education—we are united because we share a love for God.

How have you been blessed by God and by this faith community? On Christ the King Sunday, Nov. 22, express your gratitude by bringing to worship or mailing your Time & Talent and financial pledge card.

The Session has met with our Presbytery Committee on Ministry liaison, Rev. Claire Pula, and the C.O.M. chair, Elder Thad Livingston, to begin the process of searching for a new



pastor. We attended the Visioning Process led by Rev. Wendy Bailey, and we were inspired by your participation (and the unexpected blessing from Iowa of Harold Tindall who donated money for our supper)! In addition, the Presbytery invested in a Mission Insite program that provides current information about the church and broader community. With all of this and much prayer, we have a good idea of your hopes and dreams, and God's hopes and dreams for the church.

We have had separate meetings to draft our Ministry Information Form which is in progress. When that is approved by the C.O.M., it will be posted on the PC(USA) website, matched with ministers who are searching for a call and the search will begin. We are working as quickly as possible. But we trust that God is involved in the process and we will be led by God's Spirit. If we do not have a pastor when Christina retires, the COM will appoint a Moderator for Session, and we will get preachers from the Pulpit Supply List. Remember, we are the church, and Christ is the head of the church.

For those who are wondering why the congregation has not had a meeting to elect a pastor nominating committee, the Book of Order now has two categories of pastors: installed and temporary. A pastor nominating committee of the congregation searches for an installed pastor, and the Session searches for a temporary pastor. Our church has not had an installed pastor for about twelve years. At this point, we feel called to seek a temporary part-time pastor who will be willing and able to serve here for a long time. (Temporary does not mean short-term.) Contracting with a "stated supply pastor" gives us more flexibility in negotiating the terms of call. Many churches in the Presbytery do not have installed pastors. As we continue to communicate with the C.O.M. liaisons and begin talking with candidates, the call process may change. But at this particular time in the life of the church, we feel called to seek another stated supply pastor.

We will keep the congregation advised of our progress, and we ask that you keep the Session in your prayers. We trust that God already has someone in mind to serve with us. Help us be patient, diligent and faithful in the call process.
