






Join us for a pot-luck supper after worship on September 7. The sign-up sheet is on the table in the sanctuary or call the office and let us know that you are coming!

PW Purpose—Forgiven and freed by God in Jesus Christ, and empowered by the Holy Spirit, we commit ourselves:

- to nurture our faith through prayer and Bible study,
- to support the mission of the church worldwide,
- to work for justice and peace, and
- to **build an inclusive, caring community of women** that strengthens the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and witnesses to the promise of God's kingdom.

And that is exactly what we do! In 2014, we gained "An Abiding Hope" as we studied Exodus and Deuteronomy. We contributed to the church's mission by stuffing warm socks with toiletries for people who are homeless, baking and sending cookies to college students with our prayers at exam time, contributing \$242 to the P.W. global Least Coin ministry, purchasing 49 blankets for CWS disaster relief, and donating \$143 to our church's Food Pantry. We also led worship and decorated the sanctuary for Christmas. And in all we strived to live in harmony with one another as a witness to the church through fellowship and engaging programs.















<u>All</u> women, of <u>all</u> ages, are welcome to join with us at **1:30 pm on the 2nd Monday** of each month, starting September 8. This year we will study Paul's letters to the Corinthians. Sunday School classes start back up on Sunday, September 7. The classes are:

Toddlers-Preschool in the Living Room for age-appropriate videos, games and lessons.

Early Elementary (K-gr.2) in the Fellowship Hall Classroom **Older Elementary** (gr. 3 to 6) in the Lower Level Classroom

The children participate in the first 15 minutes of worship in the sanctuary with their families and then go to their Sunday School classroom after the Children's Message.

The Church's Mission also includes: monthly meetings of the Ocean County Deaf Club and the Seniors Deaf Club, and weekly meetings of Cub Scout Pack 10 and Boy Scout Troop 10 and N.A. And we hope to start an Al-Anon meeting at the Church. We also distribute food at Thanksgiving and Christmas gifts to children in need at Lakehurst Elementary School, and budget funds for local and global ministries and emergent needs.

Taking Care of Your Skin in the Sun By BJ Nelson, Parish Nurse



Are you a "sun bunny?" Do you sit out, tanning to a crispy brown to feel "I am healthy if I have good color during summer and into the fall." The fact of the matter is being safe in the sun can decrease exposure to cancer: limiting ultraviolet rays by staying in the shade, putting on a shirt, wearing sunscreen, wearing a hat and sunglasses. Avoid tanning beds. This may foil your purpose to become "crispy brown" but it will also foil your body's tendency to develop melanoma or other skin cancers.

Ocean County ranked first in the state for melanoma-related deaths: 302 from 2000 to 2010, according to the NJ Cancer Registry. Detection is the key to keeping a cancer from turning deadly. More than half of cancer deaths can be prevented if people make healthy choices.

Maintain a healthy weight. Be as lean a possible without being underweight; be physically active. 150 min. of moderate exercise or 75 min. of intense exercise each week; eat a healthy diet with the emphasis on plant foods, limit choices of red & processed meats, choose whole grains instead of refined grain products; limit alcohol intake; get all recommended screening tests done.

According to the National Cancer Institute, patients with an early stage of the disease may live for many years. People have many options if they are diagnosed early. "The biggest and most important thing to keep cancer from turning deadly is for someone to have early detection." Avoid tobacco, limit sun exposure and artificial sweeteners are high on the list, along with high levels of radiation and inherited genetic mutations.

There is a big push in the coastal counties of NJ to try to reduce the risk of skin cancer through a program called Choose Your Cover. They advocate everyone seeing a dermatologist once a year to be safe.






